Deacon Gary urged the school board and the community in general to be at the forefront of prevention of drug abuse among our youth. Deacon Gary suggested the county consider redirecting available funds from law enforcement to drug prevention. Mr. Nofi thanked Deacon Gary for his remarks and suggestions. Mr. Nofi advised that the school district has worked and will continue to work with local legislators and members of the town board on behalf of our youth.

- 6. <u>INDEMNIFICATION and HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION</u>: The SERVICE PROVIDER further agrees that it shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the SCHOOL DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents and employees for all loss, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement in connection with a terminated, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding arising from any act, error or omission, misstatement, misleading statement, neglect or breach of duties by the SERVICE PROVIDER or any of its officers, directors, agents or employees taken or made with respect to this Agreement. The SERVICE PROVIDER is not indemnifying the SCHOOL DISTRICT for any claims arising out of the SCHOOL DISTRICT'S negligence or willful misconduct during the term of this Agreement.
  - 1. <a href="INSURANCE PROVISION">INSURANCE PROVISION</a>: The SERVICE PROVIDER shall purchase from and maintain in a company or companies lawfully licensed to do business in the State of New York such insurance as will protect the SERVICE PROVIDER and the SCHOOL DISTRICT from claims set forth below for which the SERVICE PROVIDER may be legally liable, whether such operations be by the SERVICE PROVIDER or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable. Notwithstanding any terms, conditions or provisions, in any other writing between the parties, the SERVICE PROVIDER hereby agrees to effectuate the naming of the SCHOOL DISTRICT as an additional insured on the SERVICE PROVIDER's insurance policies, with the exception of workers' compensation, N.Y. State disability and professional liability. If the policy is written on a claims-made basis, the retroactive date must precede the date of the contract. The policy naming the SCHOOL DISTRICT as an additional insured shall:
    - a. Purchase an insurance policy from an A.M. Best rated "secured" insurer, licensed in New York State.
    - State that the organization's coverage shall be primary and non-contributory coverage for the SCHOOL DISTRICT, its Board, employees and volunteers.
    - c. The SCHOOL DISTRICT shall be listed as an additional insured by using endorsement CG 2026 or equivalent. A completed copy of the endorsement must be attached to the certificate of insurance.
    - d. The certificate of insurance must describe the specific services provided by the SERVICE PROVIDER (e.g. physical therapy, psychological services) that are covered by the commercial general liability policy and the umbrella policy.
    - e. At the SCHOOL DISTRICT's request, the SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide a copy of the declaration page of the liability and umbrella policies with a list of endorsements and forms. If so requested, the SERVICE PROVIDER will provide a copy of the policy endorsements and forms.
    - f. The SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to indemnify the SCHOOL DISTRICT for any applicable

#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

### BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

and

#### ROCKY POINT SCHOOL RELATED PROFESSIONALS' ASSOCIATION

THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT is entered into by the Board of Education of the Rocky Point Union Free School District (the "District") and the Rocky Point School Professionals' Association (the "Association"), collectively referred to as the "Parties."

This Agreement is for the purpose of establishing an annual protocol for posting the Event Management and School Safety/Emergency Planning stipend. The Parties agree that the District will post the availability of the Event Management and School Safety/Emergency stipend in each school building during the first week of July each year beginning with the 2014-15 school year. If the District intends to fill the position, the posting of this stipend position will continue until the stipend is no longer offered. In return, the Association agrees to withdraw the January 28, 2014, improper practice charge filed with the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB) and any and all claims related to this stipend issue, including, but not limited to, the outstanding grievance.

This Agreement shall not have any retroactive or prospective application for any stipends prior or subsequent to the date of this Agreement. Moreover, this Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time. Said termination shall be evidenced for the District via a letter from the Superintendent and for the Association via a letter from the President of the Association.

The Parties further agree that this Agreement shall not be precedent-setting nor binding upon the Parties in the future. Moreover, the Parties agree that this Memorandum of Agreement shall not be used and/or admitted into evidence in connection with any subsequent claim, litigation, arbitration, cause of action or proceeding of any kind and nature in any jurisdiction or forum and shall not be deemed an admission of any wrongdoing by the parties.
