XXVI NEW BUSINESS

Mrs. Sullivan inquired of the trustees if there was any new business they wished to discuss.

At 7:21 p.m. Ms. Ward shared that they will be proceeding with the formation of a Legislative Committee. She added that they will be soliciting members from each facet of the community including, but not limited to members of the PTA, RPTA and SRP unions. Ms. Ward announced that their first meeting is scheduled to take place in May or June where they will set the agenda for the upcoming school year. Anyone interested in joining the committee should reach out to Ms. Ward.

There was no further new business.

Once again Mrs. Sullivan invited the meeting attendees for questions/comments.

 Mr. Cohn advocated for a 9-period school day. He expressed a concern that other schools were able to make the transition without the contingency of additional funding. Mr. Cohn emphasized the importance of adequate recess time as well as the elimination of the need for special education students to choose between resource room and LOTE. He urged the Board to strive to, not only meet the minimum requirements, but to exceed them.

- Ms. Subject shared her frustration that the 9-period day plan is contingent upon additional funding. She voiced concerns that some students are currently forced to give up their lunch period at a time where socialization is very important. Ms. Subject added that difficult class choices had to be made due to only having an 8-period day.
- Ms. Cohn reiterated concern that the students are being forced to make unfair sacrifices when choosing their classes due to the limits of the 8-period school day. She also stressed the importance of the need to play, socialization and learning peoples skills. Ms. Cohn asked for assurances that the 9-period day plan would come to fruition.
- Ms. Weisman expressed her appreciation, on behalf of the Booster Club, to Mrs. Crossan, Dr. O'Brien and Mr. Delargy for the great success of the Wizards game. She also thanked the players: Mr. Apicella, Ms. Boyle, Mr. Bullis, Mr. Capell, Mr. Colon, Mr. Connelly, Mr. Delargy, Mr. Durney, Ms. Fisher, Mr. LaRosa, Ms. Larson, Ms. Licata, Ms. McGuire, Ms. Neckin, Dr. O'Brien, Ms. Serpico, Mr. Stern, Mr.
 Westerlund and Mr. Yashowitz. Additionally, Mrs. Weisman thanked the scorekeeper -Mr. Maggio, the referee - Mr. Moorman and the coach - Mr. Moeller and all of the volunteers that donated their time and contributed to such a successful night.
- Dr. Pinkenburg shared his excitement hearing a plan for a 9-period day and its allowance for additional electives. He reiterated concerns of long bathroom lines during school. Dr. O'Brien suggested he reach out to the Principal to discuss his concerns.
- Mr. Contes inquired if hard copy books were still being utilized. He also asked if they were able to be recycled or receive a rebate for the unused books. Mrs. Sullivan and Dr. O'Brien stated that they would look into it.
- Ms. Kelly asked if the extra help period would still exist in the 9-period school day. Dr. O'Brien explained that the details have not been finalized. Ms. Kelly also inquired when the RPTA contract was set to expire. Dr. O'Brien stated the current contract expires in 2025. Ms. Kelly asked if there was an existing policy to include checking identification for vendors that work within the school buildings. Dr. O'Brien shared that most of the work is completed outside of school hours. He added that if emergency repairs were needed, vendors would follow the same procedures as parents when entering the school.
- Ms. McCarthy spoke regarding a specific representative from an outside agency and his inappropriate behavior towards a student. She stressed the importance of security protocols. Dr. O'Brien stated he would discuss this further in private, along with the Principal.
- Ms. Solano inquired as to where to find the COVID-19 positive rate information. Dr. O'Brien directed her to a website containing daily reports that allows you to search by both town or school district.
- Ms. Vergara brought forth concerns with the high number of hours of screen time associated with the use of the school issued chromebooks. She inquired if there is a plan to continue with the electronic learning format. Dr. O'Brien stated that chromebooks would continue to be used along with hard copy materials as well.

- Ms. Walsh stressed her concern with a 9-period day being contingent upon receiving additional aid. She requested to know where the COVID aid funds have been spent. Mr. Van Cott advised that the American Rescue Plan containing all planned expenditures can be located on the District's website homepage. Ms. Walsh also spoke about the importance of not allowing COVID testing of students in school.
- Mr. Ford advocated for a 9-period day and provided comparisons of instructional minutes in neighboring school districts.
- Mr. Diesa spoke regarding the auditor's report and the high employee overtime expenditures during a period when the buildings were not open. Mr. Van Cott clarified the timeline of the audit report, noting it was pre-pandemic, from July 1, 2017 April 2019.
- Ms. Diesa inquired if our school district has been penalized or fined as a result of not being in compliance with the required number of instructional hours. Dr. O'Brien explained that there have been no fines or penalties, as a waiver for RPUFSD was filed with and approved by the NYSED.
 Ms. Diesa asked if the 9-period day could be put into action earlier than proposed.
 Mrs. Sullivan shared that they are actively working on plans but are not able to implement this change earlier than expected. She clarified that it does not have to wait until the RPTA's contact is up in 2025 as they can amend it, but it cannot start prior to September 2023 due to the immense amount of necessary planning required. Dr. O'Brien added that contracts with the bus company as well as course selection would not allow for the newly structured day to begin in the middle of the school year.

There were no further questions/comments.

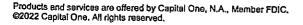

AFFORDABLE CARE ACT ADMINISTRATION AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") made as of this ______ day of ______, 2022 by Seneca Consulting Group, Inc., a New York corporation having an office located at 960 Wheeler Road #5367 Hauppauge NY 11788 (hereinafter referred to as "ADMINISTRATOR") and Rocky Point Union Free School District, having its administrative offices at 90 Rocky Point-Yaphank Road Rocky Point NY 11778, (hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT").

WHEREAS, ADMINISTRATOR, an employee benefits Administrator, provides professional fee-based benefits consulting and administrative services and;

WHEREAS, DISTRICT desires to retain ADMINISTRATOR to provide consulting and Affordable Care Act administration and ADMINISTRATOR is capable and willing to provide the services to DISTRICT.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and undertakings herein agreed, and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

- (1) Appointment as ADMINISTRATOR. DISTRICT hereby engages and appoints ADMINISTRATOR to provide employee benefit consulting services and to act as DISTRICT's authorized agent (an authorized agent is a person or firm that, with the payor's authorization, transmits specific information and/or Affordable Care Act ("ACA") return documents to the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on behalf of the payor and may match name/TIN combinations). ADMINISTRATOR agrees to provide DISTRICT with the services set forth in Exhibit A.
- (2) ADMINISTRATOR'S Duties. ADMINISTRATOR agrees that:

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- I. It will use its best efforts to support the objectives of DISTRICT on behalf of DISTRICT;
- II. It has no authorization whatsoever from DISTRICT to alter, modify or change any of the terms, rates and/or conditions contained in any of DISTRICT's documents, proposals or contracts, nor does it have authorization to change, alter or discharge participation in DISTRICT's benefit programs, and/or to incur any indebtedness on behalf of DISTRICT;
- III. It will not circumvent, or attempt to circumvent, DISTRICT in DISTRICT's relationship with, other thirdparty administrators, underwriters, vendors, insurance carriers and like organizations, regardless of whether or not DISTRICT has a written contract with such third-party administrators, underwriters, vendors, insurance carriers or like organizations.
- IV. It will provide comprehensive tracking of employee hours of service to determine "Full-Time" "Part-Time" status based on the DISTRICT's adoption of the IRS Safe Harbors per IRS Notices 2012-58, 2012-17, 2011-36, 2011-73. "Measurement Period Report"
- V. It will prepare and provide to the DISTRICT written Measurement Period Reports four (4) times per fiscal year on a quarterly basis.
- VI. It will prepare and provide the DISTRICT with DRAFT IRS Forms 1095C and 1095B for individuals required to receive one based on §6056 and §6055, and per the District's adoption of the IRS Safe Harbors pursuant to IRS Notices 2012-58, 2012-17, 2011-36, 2011-73
- VII. It will as be needed and/or requested by DISTRICT, revise DRAFT IRS Forms 1095C and 1095B and provide the revised forms to the district.
- VIII.  - (16) HIPAA. ADMINISTRATOR is and will remain in compliance with the privacy and security requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act. The parties have executed a Business Associate Agreement (attached hereto as Exhibit B).
 - (17) Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law, ADMINISTRATOR indemnifies and will defend (with counsel selected by DISTRICT) and hold harmless DISTRICT, its employees, agents, representatives and members of the Board of Education, from any and all liabilities, losses, costs, damages, and expenses (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements) arising from any claims, disputes, or causes of action of whatever nature arising, in whole or in part, from the performance of ADMINISTRATOR's Services hereunder, or the action of, or the failure to act by ADMINISTRATOR, ADMINISTRATOR's representatives or employees, or anyone for whose acts ADMINISTRATOR may be liable.

In the event that any legal proceeding is instituted or any claim or demand with respect to the foregoing is asserted by any person in respect of which indemnification may be sought from ADMINISTRATOR pursuant to the provisions of this Paragraph 17, DISTRICT will promptly notify ADMINISTRATOR of such suit, claim or demand, and give ADMINISTRATOR an opportunity to defend and settle same without any cost to DISTRICT, and will extend reasonable cooperation to ADMINISTRATOR in connection with such defense, which will be at the expense of ADMINISTRATOR. Proof of coverage must be on the approved specific form; as required by the New York State Workers' Compensation Board. ACORD certificates are not acceptable.

If written on a "claims-made" basis, the retroactive date must pre-date the inception of this Agreement. Coverage must remain in effect for two calendar years following the completion of work.
- Fidelity Bond: For dishonest acts of ADMINISTRATOR's employees with coverage for computer fraud and fund transfer including client coverage.
- Excess Insurance: \$3,000,000 each occurrence and aggregate. Excess coverage must be on a follow-form basis.

Notwithstanding any terms, conditions, or provisions, in any other writing between the parties, ADMINISTRATOR hereby agrees to effectuate the naming of DISTRICT as an additional insured on ADMINISTRATOR's insurance policies, except for workers' compensation, N.Y. State disability and professional liability. Each policy naming DISTRICT as an additional insured must:

- Be an insurance policy from an A.M. Best rated "secure" or better insurer, licensed in New York State.
- State that ADMINISTRATOR's coverage is primary and non-contributory coverage for DISTRICT, its Board, employees, and volunteers.

DISTRICT must be listed as an additional insured by using endorsement CG 2026 or its equivalent. The decision to accept an alternative endorsement rest solely with DISTRICT. A completed copy of the endorsement must be attached to the certificate of insurance and the certificate must state that the endorsement is being used. The certificate of insurance must describe the specific services provided by ADMINISTRATOR (e.g., physical therapy, psychological services) that are covered by the commercial general liability policy and the umbrella policy. At DISTRICT's request, ADMINISTRATOR will provide a copy of the declarations page of its liability and umbrella policies with a list of endorsements and forms. If so requested, ADMINISTRATOR will provide a copy of the policy endorsements and forms.

ADMINISTRATOR hereby indemnifies DISTRICT for any applicable deductibles and selfinsured retentions, all of which are the sole responsibility of ADMINISTRATOR, to the extent not covered by the applicable policy.

If a policy is written on a "claims-made" basis, the retroactive date must pre-date the inception of this Agreement.

ADMINISTRATOR acknowledges that failure to obtain the foregoing insurance on behalf of DISTRICT constitutes a material breach of contract. ADMINISTRATOR must provide DISTRICT with proof satisfactory to DISTRICT that the above requirements have been met, prior to the commencement of work or use of DISTRICT facilities. The failure of DISTRICT to object to the contents of the certificate or the absence of same will not be deemed a waiver of all rights held by DISTRICT. Upon request, ADMINISTRATOR will provide DISTRICT with a copy of ADMINISTRATOR's applicable insurance policies including any endorsements, modifications, or exclusions thereto.

DISTRICT is a member/owner of the New York Schools Insurance Reciprocal ("NYSIR"). ADMINISTRATOR acknowledges that the procurement of that insurance as required herein is intended to benefit not only DISTRICT, but also NYSIR as DISTRICT's insurer.

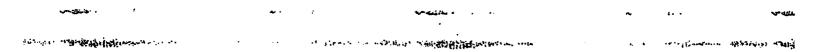

- (26) Negotiated Agreement. This is a negotiated Agreement. It will not be construed against any party by reason of this Agreement being prepared by that party's attorney. Each party warrants that it/he/she has full power to execute, deliver and perform this Agreement and has taken all actions required by law, organizational documents or otherwise to authorize the execution and delivery of this Agreement.
- (27) Iran Divestment Act of 2012. By signing this Agreement, each person and each person signing on behalf of any other party certifies, and in the case of a joint bid or partnership each party thereto certifies as to its/his/her own organization, under penalty of perjury, that to the best of its/his/her knowledge and belief that each person is not on the list created pursuant New York State Finance Law § 165-a(3)(b).
- (28) Confidentiality of Records and Data Security and Privacy. ADMINISTRATOR must comply with all District policies and State, federal, and local laws, regulations, rules, and requirements related to the confidentiality of records and data security and privacy.

ADMINISTRATOR will assist DISTRICT with meeting the DISTRICT's "Employer Mandate" obligations and reporting requirements pursuant to the ACA by:

EXHIBIT B BUSINESS ASSOCIATE AGREEMENT

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This Agreement ("Agreement") between Seneca Consulting Group, Inc., a New York Corporation with principal office and place of business at 960 Wheeler Road #5367 Hauppauge, NY 11788 (herein "CONSUL/TANT") and Rocky Point Union Free School District, having its principal place of business at 90 Rocky Point-Yaphank Road Rocky Point NY 11778, (hereinafter referred to as the "District").

<u>WITNESSETH</u>

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WHEREAS, CONSULTANT provides employee benefit consulting services to District which relates to the group health insurance program provided to the participants of such District; and

WHEREAS, the parties acknowledge that they are subject to the rules of HIPAA and that this Agreement is required by HIPAA regarding certain EDI, Privacy and Security standards applicable to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, District and CONSULTANT have entered into a relationship under which CONSULTANT may receive, use, obtain, access or create Protected Health Information (as that term is defined in Paragraph I(e) of this Exhibit to the Agreement) from or on behalf of District in the course of providing goods and services to District and its participants; and

WHEREAS, such Protected Health Information is confidential and must be afforded special treatment and protection, such that all information can be used or disclosed only in accordance with the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information set forth at 45 CFR Parts 160 and 164 (hereinafter "the Privacy Rule") as implemented in the parties' relationship by this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, CONSULTANT acknowledges that it is a Consultant of District under the terms of HIPAA in its operation of this Agreement.

I Definitions.

- (a) Breach. "Breach" shall have the same meaning as the term "breach" in Section 13400(1) of the HITECH Act
- (b) Designated Record Set. "Designated Record Set" shall have the same meaning as the term "designated record set" in 45 CFR 164.501, limited to the information created or received by CONSULTANT from or on behalf of District.
- (C) De-identify/De-identified. "De-identify/De-identified" means to remove, encode, encrypt, or otherwise eliminate or conceal data that identifies an individual, or modifies information so that there is no reasonable basis to believe that the information can be used to identify an individual
- (d) Disclose. The release transfer or provision of access to PHI, whether oral or recorded in any form or medium.
- (e) Individual. "Individual" shall have the same meaning as the term "individual" in 45 CFR 164.501 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance with 45 CFR 164.502(g).
- (f) Privacy Rule. "Privacy Rule" shall mean the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information at 45 CFR part 160 and part 164, subparts A and E.
- (g) Protected Health Information. "Protected Health Information" shall have the same meaning as the term "protected health information" in 45 CFR 164.501, limited to the information created or received by Consultant from or on behalf of District.
- (h) Secretary. "Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or his designee.
- Business Associate. "Business Associate" shall mean Consultant. Covered Entity. "Covered Entity" shall mean Rocky Point Union Free School District
- we (j) Minimum Necessary Information. "Minimum Necessary Information" means (i) in the case of routine and recurring types of disclosures, the set of data or records which the disclosing party's policies and

the case of non-routine and non-recurring disclosures, the set of data or records which the Disclosing Party determines is reasonably necessary to accomplish the purpose of the disclosure, upon review of each

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disclosure according to criteria developed by the Disclosing Party; provided that in the case of disclosure (A) to a Covered Entity, (B) to a professional for purposes of providing professional services to the Disclosing Party; nor (C) to a public official for disclosures which are permitted by: law without Individual consent, the Minimum Necessary Information shall be the set of data or records requested by that party, upon the party's reasonable representation that the request is for the minimum necessary given the purpose of disclosure(s).

155. <u>Obligations and Activities of Consultant.</u> Consultant agrees to:

(a) not use or disclose Protected Health Information other than as permitted or required by this Agreement or as required By Law.

(b) use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of the Protected Health Information other than as provided for by this Agreement.

(c) mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is known to consultant of a use or disclosure of Protected Health Information by Consultant in violation of the requirements of this Agreement.

(f) provide access, at the request of District, within 48 hours, to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set, to District or, as directed by District, to an Individual to meet the requirements under 45 CFR 164.524.

(g) make any amendment(s) to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set that the District directs or agrees to pursuant to 45 CFR 164.526 at the request of District or an Individual, and within 48 hours of such request.

(h) make internal practices, books, and records, including policies and procedures and Protected Health Information, relating to the use and disclosure of Protected Health Information received from, or created or received by Consultant on behalf of, District available to the District, or to the Secretary, in a time and manner or designated by the Secretary, for purposes of the Secretary determining District's compliance with the Privacy Rule.

(i) document such disclosures of Protected Health Information and information related to such disclosures as would be required for District to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with 45 CFR 164.528.

(j) provide to District or an Individual, within 48 hours of a request, information collected in accordance with Section (i) above of this Agreement, to permit District to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with 45 CFR 164.528.

156. <u>Permitted Uses and Disclosures by Consultant.</u>

Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement, Consultant may use or disclose Protected Health Information to perform functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of, District, provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the Privacy Rule if done by District or the minimum necessary policies and procedures of the District.

This provision shall apply to Protected Health Information that is in the possession of subcontractors or agents of Consultant. Consultant shall retain no copies of the Protected Health Information.

ii. In the event that Consultant determines that returning or destroying the Protected Health Information is infeasible, Consultant shall provide immediately to District notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible. Upon submittal of written proof, satisfactory to District, that return or destruction of Protected Health Information is infeasible, Consultant shall extend the protections of this Agreement to such Protected Health Information and limit further uses and disclosures of such Protected Health Information to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Consultant maintains such Protected Health Information.

7. Indemnification.

Consultant agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless District and their affiliates, trustees, officers, directors, employees, successors and assigns from and against any and all claims, penalties, liabilities, losses, damages, suites, settlements, judgments or costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which may arise from the acts or omissions of Consultants in performing under this Agreement.

8.<u>Audit.</u>

Upon sixty (60) days' prior notice, District may audit Consultant's performance pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, the internal privacy practices of Consultant. District shall choose the Auditor in its sole discretion. The Audit shall be conducted on CONSULTANT's premises during regular business hours and CONSULTANT shall make available its books, records and procedures regarding compliance with Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 Privacy Rule and any applicable amendments thereto.

9. Miscellaneous.

(a) Regulatory References. A reference in the Agreement to a section in the Privacy Rule means the section as in effect or as amended.

(b) Amendment. The Parties agree to take such action as is necessary to amend the Agreement from time to time pursuant to a written agreement signed by the Parties and is necessary for District to comply with the requirements of the Privacy Rule and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, Pub. L. No. 104-191

(c) Survival. The respective rights and obligations of Consultant under Section 2(f), 2(g), 6(c) and (7) of this Exhibit "B" shall survive the termination of the Agreement.

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(d) Interpretation. Any ambiguity in the Agreement shall be resolved to permit District to comply with the Privacy Rule.

HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICE AGREEMENT

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THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this first day of July 2021, by and between the Board of Education of the South Huntington Union Free School District (hereinafter "PROVIDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 60 Weston Street, Huntington Station, NY 11746, and the Board of Education of the ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter "SENDER"), having its principal place of business for the purpose of this Agreement at 90 Rocky Point-Yaphank Road, Rocky Point, NY 11778.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, South Huntington Union Free School District is authorized pursuant to Section 912 of the Education Law, to enter into a contract with SENDER for the purpose of having South Huntington UFSD provide health and welfare services for children residing in the Rocky Point UFSD and attending a non-public school located in the South Huntington Union Free School District,

WHEREAS, certain students who are residents of SENDER are attending non-public schools located in South Huntington UFSD,

WHEREAS, South Huntington UFSD has received a request(s) from said non-public schools for the provision of health and welfare services to the aforementioned students,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained in this Agreement, the parties hereby mutually agree as follows:

- 1. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 inclusive.
- 2. South Huntington UFSD warrants that the health and welfare services will be provided by licensed health care providers. South Huntington UFSD further represents that such services shall be performed by health care providers that are licensed under the laws of the State of New York, including New York State Department of Health and State Education Department licensing requirements, if applicable. South Huntington Union Free School District further represents that such services will be in accordance with all applicable provisions of Federal, State, and local laws, rules and regulations, including, Section 912 of the Education Law, and the student's IEP, if applicable. South Huntington UFSD shall certify that all service providers possess documentation evidencing such license qualifications as required by Federal, State, and local laws, rules, rules, regulations and orders.
- 3. South Huntington Union Free School District understands and agrees that it will comply and is responsible for complying with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules and regulations with respect to the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 4. The services provided by South Huntington UFSD shall be consistent with the services available to students attending public schools within the South Huntington UFSD; and may include, but are not limited to:

- a. all services performed by a physician, physician assistant, registered professional nurse, nurse practitioner, school psychologist, school social worker, or school speech therapist,
- b. Vision and hearing screening examinations,

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- c. The taking of medical histories and the administration of health screening tests,
- d. the maintenance of cumulative health records, and
- e. the administration of emergency care programs for ill or injured students.

It is expressly understood and agreed between the parties that the services to be provided pursuant to this Agreement shall not include any teaching services.

- 5. In exchange for the provision of health and welfare services pursuant to this Agreement, Rocky Point UFSD agrees to pay South Huntington UFSD the sum of **§817.80** per eligible pupil for the **2021-2022** school year.
- 6. SENDER shall pay South Huntington UFSD within thirty (30) days of SENDER's receipt of a detailed written invoice from South Huntington UFSD. Said invoice shall specify the services provided, dates that the invoice covers, and the total amount due for the period specified.
- 7. If, during the term of this Agreement, a student becomes eligible to receive services pursuant to this Agreement, South Huntington UFSD shall undertake to provide services pursuant to this Agreement, and the amount of compensation owed by SENDER shall be prorated accordingly to accurately reflect the period of time services were provided to the student.
- 8. If, during the term of this Agreement, a student ceases to be eligible to receive services pursuant to this Agreement, South Huntington UFSD shall no longer be responsible for providing services to that student pursuant to this Agreement, and the amount of compensation owed by SENDER shall be prorated accordingly to accurately reflect the period of time services were provided to the student.
- 9. South Huntington UFSD shall furnish any supplies or equipment necessary to provide the services pursuant to this Agreement to the extent such items are not provided by the nonpublic school.
- 10. Both parties agree to provide the State access to all relevant records which the State requires to determine either South Huntington UFSD's or SENDER's compliance with applicable Federal, State, or local laws, rules or regulations with respect to provision of services pursuant to this Agreement. Both parties agree to retain all materials and records relevant to the execution or performance of their obligations pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with the record retention requirements for such materials and records.
- 11. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA") and information protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"). The Parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and FERPA and, if necessary, shall execute a Business Associate Agreement in connection with such responsibilities.
- 12. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services provided for in this Agreement is deemed confidential

parties waives any objection which it may have based on improper venue or forum non conveniens to the conduct of and proceeding in any such court.

- 19. This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the Agreement between the parties, and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written: agreements, proposals, understandings, representations, conditions or covenants between the parties relating to the subject matter of the Agreement.
- 20. This Agreement may not be changed orally, but only by an Agreement, in writing, signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
- 21. It is mutually agreed that this contract shall not become valid and binding upon either party until the contract is approved by the Superintendent of School for the Rocky Point UFSD

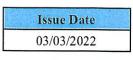

WHEREAS, the <u>Rocky Point Union Free School District</u>, an educational/municipal corporation (hereinafter the "Participant") is desirous of selectively participating with other educational and/or municipal corporations in the State of New York in joint bidding in the areas mentioned above pursuant to General Municipal Law § 119-0 and Education Law Section 1950; and

WHEREAS, the Participant is a municipality within the meaning of General Municipal Law § 119-n and is eligible to participate in the Board of Cooperative Educational Services, First Supervisory District of Suffolk County (hereinafter Eastern Suffolk BOCES) Joint Municipal Cooperative Bidding Program (hereinafter the "Program") in the areas mentioned above; and

WHEREAS, the Participant acknowledges receipt of the Program description inclusive of Eastern Suffolk BOCES' standard bid packet and the general conditions relating to said Program; and

WHEREAS, with respect to all activities conducted by the Program, the Participant wishes to delegate to Eastern Suffolk BOCES the responsibility for drafting of bid specifications, advertising for bids, accepting and opening bids, tabulating bids, awarding the bids, and reporting the results to the Participant.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Participant hereby appoints Eastern Suffolk BOCES to represent it and to act as the lead agent in all matters related to the Program as described above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant hereby authorizes Eastern Suffolk BOCES to place all legal advertisements for any required cooperative bidding in <u>Newsday</u>, which is designated as the official newspaper for the Program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a Participant Meeting shall be held annually consisting of a representative from each Program Participant. Notice of the meeting shall be given to each representative at least five (5) days prior to such meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that an Advisory Committee will be formed consisting of five to ten representatives of Program Participants for a term of three (3) years as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-0.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Agreement with the Participant shall be for a term of one (1) year as authorized by General Municipal Law §119-0.2.j.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Participant agrees to pay Eastern Suffolk BOCES an annual fee as determined annually by Eastern Suffolk BOCES to act as the lead agent for the Program.

AGREEMENT, made this 12th day of April 2022 by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION of the ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (Rocky Point UFSD), Town of Brookhaven, 90 Rocky Point – Yaphank Road, Rocky Point, New York, 11778, ("Rocky Point") and Hedieh Resciniti, 58 Neal Lane, Setauket, NY, 11720.

WITNESSETH: WHEREAS, Hedieh Resciniti is a non-resident of the Rocky Point Union Free School District living at 58 Neal Lane, Setauket, NY, 11720; and

WHEREAS, Hedieh Resciniti desires to maintain the enrollment of her child, Lily Resciniti (grade 12) for the remainder of the 2021-2022 school year in the Rocky Point Union Free School District, specifically Rocky Point High School, as a non-district resident student as per Board of Education Policy #7130 Criteria for Admission under Special Circumstances;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein set forth, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. Lily Resciniti (grade 12) shall be permitted to remain in the Rocky Point UFSD until June 24, 2022 and shall receive instruction for a period ending June 24, 2022; said student shall be entitled to and shall receive like and equal instruction to that imparted to the children of like ages, grades and departments and shall be accorded all the rights and privileges enjoyed by resident students in attendance at said Rocky Point High School.
- 2. As stated in Board of Education Policy #5730--Transportation of Students--non-resident families must provide their own transportation. Therefore, Hadieh Resciniti will be responsible for providing her child, Lily Resciniti (grade 12), with transportation to and from school.

Paper Education Company Inc. Service Agreement

THIS Paper Education Company Inc. SERVICE AGREEMENT is entered into by and between:

Paper Education Company Inc. a Federal corporation having its principal place of business at 279 Sherbrooke Street West #410, Montreal, Quebec, Canada, H2X 1Y2 ("**Paper Education Company Inc.**"); and

Rocky Point Union Free School District is an educational institution having its head office at 90 Rocky Point Yaphank Rd, Rocky Point, NY United States ("**Customer**").

(each a "Party" and collectively the "Parties")

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Paper Education Company Inc. has developed an online chat-based platform to provide students access to educators in order to obtain tutoring in connection with their courses, the features of which are more fully set out on Paper Education Company Inc.'s website located at <u>www.paper.co</u> (the "Platform");

WHEREAS, Customer wishes to allow its students to access the Platform for their educational use in connection with the courses that they are taking in order to obtain tutoring from educators ("Educators"), as well as allowing teachers and administrators to access the Platform;

WHEREAS, Paper Education Company Inc. and Customer wish to set out the contractual terms pursuant to which access to students, teachers and administrators will be given to the Platform.

THE PARTIES HAVE THEREFORE AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Purpose and Scope of the Agreement

This Agreement contains the terms and conditions relating to the provision on a "softwareas-a- service" basis or through a downloadable application of the Platform to students, teachers and administrators (each a "User") associated to the Customer. Customer acknowledges that in order to be granted access to the Platform, each User must agree to comply with the terms of service and that the failure to agree to such terms of service or non-compliance with such terms of services may result in the exclusion of the User from the Platform, as these terms of service may be modified from time to time. In the event a User is excluded due to a refusal to be bound by the terms of service or non-compliance to the terms of service, Customer shall not be entitled to reimbursement of any fees or other charges paid with respect to such User's access. It is Customer's responsibility to ensure that any parental approval or other formality required by local laws and regulations required for purposes of contractually binding Users is complied with.

2. Operation of the Platform

The Platform provides access to Educators using chat functionalities to allow students attending the Customer's institution to obtain tutoring in connection with the courses defined by the Parties. The Platform and Educators are available on a 24 hours / 7 days per week basis, subject to the limitations set out in the Service Levels defined in this Agreement. Customer acknowledges that Educators qualified to interact with students on all courses topics may not be available at all times. Teachers and administrators have access to the Platform and are provided with means to assess interactions between students and Educators.

Students may access the Platform only for their educational use in connection with the courses for which they are registered at the Customer's institution. There are no limits to the number of interactions a student may have through the Platform, provided that these stay within reasonable bounds and do not become abusive.

In order to provide access to the Platform to Users, Customer must provide all necessary data set out in Schedule "A" in the specified electronic format so as to allow Paper Education Company Inc. to configure all accounts.

The pricing set out in Schedule "A" is for the maximum number of students indicated in such Schedule. To the extent that Customer wishes to allow access to the Platform to a number of students that exceeds the number set out in Schedule "A", Customer will be offered the option to do so at the price per additional student set out in Schedule "A", subject to the minimum quantities detailed in such schedule. The fee per student access shall not be prorated regardless of the point at which during a contract year new accesses are granted to the Platform. Additional accesses granted during the term shall be confirmed through electronic communications or in writing by Paper Education Company Inc..

3. Acceptable Use of the Platform

Customer acknowledges that the following types of behavior by Customer or its Users of the Platform are unacceptable:

- (a) Posting or transmitting material that infringes, misappropriates or violates another person's intellectual property rights;
- (b) Posting or transmitting material that violates any right of publicity, right of privacy

or other similar rights;

- (c) Using the Platform for purposes of stalking, harassing, threatening, bullying or other similar behavior;
- (d) Posting or transmitting material that is defamatory, sexual in nature (other than as justified in light of the course content), obscene, offensive or discriminatory;
- (e) Posting or transmitting any defamatory, pornographic, inaccurate, abusive, obscene, profane or offensive content.
- (f) Compromising the integrity or operation of the Platform or attempting to do so;
- (g) Tampering with, reverse-engineering, or hacking the Platform, circumventing any security or authentication measures, or attempting to gain unauthorized access to the Platform, related systems, networks, or data;
- (h) Using "robots," "spiders," "offline readers," or other automated systems to sends more request messages to the Platform than a human could reasonably send in the same period of time by using a normal browser;
- (i) Making an unreasonable or abusive use of the access provided to the Platform;
- (j) Generating and sending unsolicited commercial communications, advertising chain letters or spam;
- (k) Uploading viruses, bots, worms, scripting exploits or other similar materials;
- (I) Posting or transmitting content that is intended to be inflammatory;
- (m)Using the Platform to recruit or solicit for employment or consulting Educators;
- (n) Otherwise engaging in behavior that is illegal.

Paper Education Company Inc. will use reasonable efforts to monitor profiles, actions, comments, and general usage of the Platform and suspend privileges to any User or Educator not adhering to the policies of the Platform. Customer agrees to promptly report any alleged improprieties of any Users or Educators of which it becomes aware via electronic correspondence so as to enable Paper Education Company Inc. to investigate such alleged improprieties.

4. **Professional Development**

Paper Education Company Inc. agrees to provide or support professional development and class launches in order to promote the use of the Platform as further detailed in Schedule "A". Unless expressly provided in Schedule "A", all such services shall be provided remotely by Customer.

5. Term of the Agreement

The initial term of the Agreement shall be as specified in Schedule "A".

6. Restrictions on Use of the Platform

Customer agrees that it shall not itself or allow any User to: (a) sell, lease, license, sublicense, loan, encumber or otherwise transfer its right to use the Platform to a third party, in whole or in part, except as permitted under this Agreement; (b) make

modifications, corrections, alterations, enhancements or other additions to the Platform; (c) provide, disclose, divulge or make the Platform available to a third party by online services, remote dial-in or network or telecommunication links of any kind, other than as permitted in this Agreement; (d) circumvent the Platform's authentication or security access control systems or assist others to do so; and (e) disclose access credentials to unauthorized parties or fail to implement reasonable security measures to prevent such an occurrence.

7. Intellectual Property in the Platform

Customer recognizes and agrees that all trade-marks, inventions (whether patentable or not), patent applications, patents, industrial designs, works protected by copyright, trade secrets, know-how or other intellectual property in or related to the Platform, including any suggestions that Customer or any User may make regarding the functionalities or other technical aspects (the "Platform Intellectual Property") are, as between the parties, the exclusive property of Paper Education Company Inc.. Upon the request of Paper Education Company Inc., Customer shall provide any reasonable documentation required to confirm Paper Education Company Inc.'s ownership in the Platform Intellectual Property. For clarity, Paper Education Company Inc. shall not own any content added to the Platform by Users or Customer, which content is licensed pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

This Agreement does not grant Customer the right to access or obtain the source code of the Platform nor any programming documentation.

All rights, titles and interests that are not expressly addressed in this Agreement are expressly reserved by Paper Education Company Inc.

8. Hosting of Platform

Unless otherwise expressly set out in Schedule "B", the Platform and associated data will be hosted in facilities located in the United States.

9. Service Level

The Platform shall be available 95% of the time, calculated on a monthly basis. The Software shall not be considered unavailable to Customer if Customer's inability to access or use the Platform arises due to problems with Customers' or Users' hardware or software, or due to problems with third-party telecommunication services or networks.

Periods during which the Platform is unavailable due to a force majeure event or previously- scheduled maintenance shall not be counted as downtime for the purpose of this provision. Paper Education Company Inc. shall take commercially-reasonable measures to ensure that scheduled maintenance takes place between 7AM ET and 9AM ET and that Customer receives advanced notice of any such maintenance.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, Customer acknowledges that Paper Education Company Inc. may need to perform emergency maintenance, for example to install security updates, without notice and that no such interruption of access to the Platform shall be considered unavailability for the purpose of calculating the service level.

10. Technical Support

Paper Education Company Inc. agrees to provide remote technical support to Customer via telephone, chat, email or other efficient communication method between 9AM ET and 5PM ET, Monday to Friday, except holidays as observed by Paper Education Company Inc.. The purpose of the remote assistance service is to attempt to identify and resolve functional problems in the Platform. Technical support shall be requested by Customer representatives, not by students.

Each communication received will be given a severity level by Paper Education Company Inc. according to the following guidelines:

- a) Major Problem: when the Platform is not operational or has suffered a major loss of capability resulting in the inability to use the Platform, or if a failure is so frequent that it precludes productive use of the Platform or when the Platform is operational but its capability is severely degraded, such as the inability to run a major application within the Platform, a critical product feature or function does not work, or a failure requires on-going intervention in order to maintain productive use;
- b) Minor Problem: when the Platform is operational and the problem does not result in a significant impact on the performance of the Platform

Paper Education Company Inc. shall exercise all commercially reasonable efforts to meet the following response times:

- c) Major Problems will be acknowledged within 4 business hours and resolved within 3 business days; and
- d) Minor Problems will be acknowledged within 1 business days and resolved in a subsequent update.

Technical support services shall not include services: (a) in respect of User hardware and software problems; (b) in respect of education, installation, training or customization; (c) in respect to the use of the Platform in violation of this Agreement; (d) in respect of defects in or caused by third party software or hardware; (e) problems arising from network connectivity.

Paper Education Company Inc. shall not be responsible to correct any defect or other failure of performance of the Platform caused by the following: (a) use of the Platform that materially deviates from the documentation included in the Platform; (b) modification, customization, alteration or addition or attempted modification, customization, alteration

or addition to the Platform; or (c) the abuse or misuse of the Platform.

Paper Education Company Inc. may update the Platform from time to time and shall make commercially reasonable efforts to advise the Customer in advance of all updates that materially affect the functionality of the Platform.

Paper Education Company Inc. shall be under no obligation to refrain from updating the Platform or delay in performing such updates.

11. Monetary Consideration

In consideration for the access granted herein to the Platform, Customer shall pay Paper Education Company Inc. the fees set forth in Schedule "A". Unless otherwise provided in Schedule "A" or as otherwise set out herein, the fees are payable in advance within thirty (30) days for the beginning of the initial term and any renewal terms. Except as otherwise set out in Schedule "A", the fees may be increased by Paper Education Company Inc. by giving the Customer thirty (30) days' prior written notice at any point in time and will be applied at the following invoice to be issued to the Customer. Customer shall have the option of terminating the Agreement by providing written notice if it disagrees with the price increase set out in Provider's written notice, provided this is done no later than at the expiration of the notice period. Except as otherwise noted in Schedule "A" to this Agreement, in the event that Customer adds additional student access during the term, fees associated with such additional accesses shall be payable within thirty (30) days of the end of the term during which they are requested. Except as otherwise noted in Schedule "A" to this Agreement, additional accesses may be purchased only in a minimum quantity of ten (10) student accesses at a time. There are no limits on the number of administrator and teacher accesses to the Platform and no charge for such accesses.

All amounts payable under this Agreement shall be non-refundable except for breach of terms of this Agreement by Paper Education Company Inc.

All payments shall be exclusive of any tariffs, duties or taxes imposed or levied by any government or governmental agency. Customer shall be liable for payment of all such taxes, however designated, levied or based on Customer's or its Users' possession or use of the Platform including, federal, provincial, state or local sales taxes. Customer agrees that all amounts payable by Customer pursuant to this Agreement shall be paid without any deduction or withholding on account of any taxes, monetary transfer fees, or other charges or withholdings of any nature, except to the extent that the deduction or withholding of any tax is required by applicable law, in which event Customer shall (i) pay to Paper Education Company Inc. such additional amount as is necessary so that Paper Education Company Inc. would have received if such deduction or withholding had not been made and (ii) deliver to Paper Education Company Inc. within thirty (30) days after the date of such payment an official receipt of the relevant taxing authority showing

that Paper Education Company Inc. paid to such taxing authority the full amount of the tax required to be deducted or withheld. Paper Education Company Inc. shall take reasonable administrative actions, if possible, to lawfully mitigate or to help recover on behalf of Customer any withholding taxes, if and only if none of the foregoing actions would operate to prejudice Provider with respect to its tax liability or otherwise.

Unless otherwise expressly set forth in a Proposal, all prices are expressed in Canadian dollars.

12. Confidentiality

Except as may be expressly provided by this Agreement, the supplemental Education Law 2-d Agreement, or applicable laws, the Parties acknowledge that Content contributed by Users to the Platform is not confidential as the functionality of the Platform are based on student interactions being visible in whole or in part to administrators and teachers. Except as otherwise provided by this Agreement or the supplemental Education Law 2-d Agreement, Paper Education Company Inc. shall not use the Content contributed by Users other than for purposes of operating the Platform for the Customer and its Users' benefit. Paper Education Company Inc. may however compile and use aggregated data (which for clarity shall not include any personally identifiable information) pertaining to the Platform derived from multiple educational institutions for purposes of (i) further developing the Platform or related products or services; (ii) compiling and disseminating data regarding the use and content of the Platform as well as the courses for which tutoring is offered on the Platform. Personally Identifiable Information provided to Paper Education Company Inc. by Customer or Users shall be treated as confidential information and is Paper Education Company subject to Inc.'s privacy policy available at https://paper.co/privacy-policy-services and incorporated herein by reference, which may be updated from time to time by Paper Education Company Inc. by posting updates on its website. The contractual terms of this Agreement constitutes confidential information of Paper Education Company Inc.

During the performance of this Agreement, one Party (the "Disclosing Party") may authorize the other Party (the "Receiving Party") to access or host confidential information (hereinafter the "Confidential Information"). Subject to the other terms of this Agreement, Confidential Information shall include, without limitation, personally identifiable information, log-in credentials, contracts, technical or financial information, databases, trade secrets and know-how. Confidential Information shall not include information that (i) is or will become public other than as a result of a breach of this Agreement or (ii) was known to the Receiving Party prior to the disclosure thereof by the Disclosing Party, as evidenced by written documents.

The Receiving Party shall preserve the confidentiality of any Confidential Information, and shall refrain from using or disclosing the same for any purpose not previously approved in writing by the Disclosing Party or otherwise provided in this Agreement. However, the Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information in cases where (i) the information

is made public through no fault of or contribution by the Receiving Party; (ii) the information was made available to the Receiving Party by a third party that was legally in possession thereof and was free to disclose same; (iii) the information was independently acquired by third parties without access to or knowledge of the Confidential Information; or (iv) this disclosure was required by law or a court order, provided that the Receiving Party gives the Disclosing Party enough advance warning of this requirement so as to give the latter enough time to adopt whatever measures may be needed to avoid or limit the disclosure.

Upon request or upon termination of this Agreement, the Receiving Party shall immediately return or, at the option of the Disclosing Party, destroy the Confidential Information. Moreover, at the request of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party agrees to certify, by means of an affidavit, that all of the Confidential Information has been returned or destroyed, as the case may be. However, Paper Education Company Inc. may retain an archival copy of all confidential information disclosed to it, to the extent required by law, regulation, or court order, or to comply with accounting principles.

13. Termination

Each Party may terminate this Agreement in the event the other Party breaches the terms of this Agreement and fails to remedy such breach within thirty (30) days of written notice given by such Party.

Notwithstanding any provision of applicable law, including section 2125 of the Quebec Civil Code (the benefit of which is hereby waived by the Customer), this Agreement may not be terminated for convenience.

All rights to access and use the Platform expire when this Agreement is terminated, regardless of the reason for termination, and no right of use or other such right to access the Platform shall subsist for Customer and all Users.

14. Responsibility for Content and Disclaimer of Representations, Warranties, Conditions

Customer and its Users are solely responsible for any content, messages, photos, videos, reviews or profiles (collectively, "Content") that are published or displayed (hereinafter, "post") on the Platform, or transmitted to other users of the Platform. Customer and Users shall not post any Content that violates is unacceptable pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Customer understands and agrees that Paper Education Company Inc. may choose to review and delete any Content, in each case in whole or in part, that in the sole judgment of Paper Education Company Inc. violates this Agreement or which might be offensive, illegal, or that might violate the rights, harm, or threaten the safety of users of the Platform. Customer and its Users grant complete access to institutions affiliated to Customer to review, record and process any Content that has been provided on the Platform. Institutions affiliated to Customer who have been granted access to their student's conversations agree that any information transmitted by Users and Educators

shall not be shared with individuals outside of their institution. By posting Content to any area of the Platform, Customer and its Users automatically grant to Paper Education Company Inc., its affiliates, licensees and successors, an irrevocable, perpetual, non-exclusive, fully paid, worldwide license to use, copy, perform, display, make available, distribute, reproduce, adapt, modify and distribute such information and content and to prepare derivative works of, or incorporate into other works, such information and content, and to grant and authorize sublicenses of the foregoing. Such license may be used by Customer subject to the restrictions and limitations provided by this Agreement. Customer further represent and warrant that public posting and use of User Content by Paper Education Company Inc. will not infringe or violate the rights of any third party.

Use of the Platform, including but not limited to the Content posted on the Platform, must be in accordance with any and all applicable laws and regulations. Opinions, advice, statements, offers, or other information or content made available on the Platform or through the Platform, but not directly by Paper Education Company Inc., are those of their respective authors. Such authors are solely responsible for such content. Supplemental Agreement dated this 31st Day of March between the ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (the "District"), located at 90 ROCKY POINT-YAPHANK ROAD, ROCKY POINT, NEW YORK, 11778, and PAPER EDUCATION COMPANY, INC. (the "Contractor" or the "Vendor") are parties to a contract or other written agreement pursuant to which Contractor will receive student data and/or teacher or principal data that is protected under New York Education Law Section 2-d and Part 121 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education (collectively referred to as "Section 2-d") from the District for purposes of providing certain products or services to the District.

WHEREAS, the District and the Vendor have entered into a service contract (hereinafter the "Service Agreement") whereby the Vendor may receive Student Data or Teacher or Principal Data, as those terms are defined in Education Law §2-d; and

WHEREAS, the Vendor represents that it will only share Protected Data with third party subcontractors if those subcontractors are contractually bound to observe substantially similar obligations to maintain the privacy and security of Protected Data as are required of the Vendor under this Contract and all applicable New York State and Federal laws.

WHEREAS, the District and the Vendor wish to enter into this Data Sharing and Confidentiality agreement (this "Supplemental Agreement" or "this Exhibit") in order to comply with Education Law §2-d. The Vendor agrees that it will comply with all terms set forth in the Service Agreement. To the extent that any terms contained in the Service Agreement, or any terms contained in any other Exhibit(s) attached to and made a part of the Service Agreement, conflict with the terms of this Exhibit, the terms of this Exhibit will apply and be given effect. In addition, in the event that the Vendor has online or written Privacy Policies or Terms of Service (collectively, "TOS") that would otherwise be applicable to its customers or users of the products or services that are the subject of the Service Agreement between the District and Contractor to the extent that any terms of the TOS, that are or may be in effect at any time during the term of the Service Agreement, conflict with the terms of this Exhibit, the terms of this Exhibit will apply and be given effect to the extent they relate to the processing, handling, protection or storage of Protected Data.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises below, the District and the Vendor agree as follows:

1. **Defined Terms**: Unless otherwise indicated below or elsewhere in this Supplemental Agreement, all capitalized terms shall have the meanings provided in Education Law §2-d.

- a. "Educational Agency" shall generally have the same meaning as the term Educational Agency at Education Law §2-d(1)(c), and in reference to the party to this Supplemental Agreement shall mean the ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- b. "Third Party Subcontractor" shall mean any person or entity, other than an Educational Agency, that receives Student Data or Teacher or Principal Data from an Educational Agency pursuant to a contract or other written agreement for purposes of providing services to such Educational Agency, including but not limited to data management or storage services, conducting studies for or on behalf of such Educational Agency, or audit or evaluation of publicly funded programs.
- c. "Protected Data" means Student Data and/or Teacher or Principal Data, to the extent applicable to the product or service actually being provided to the District by Vendor pursuant to the Agreement.
- d. "Student" means any person attending or seeking to enroll in the Educational Agency.
- e. "Student Data" means Personally Identifiable Information of a "Student."
- f. "Eligible Student" means a Student who is eighteen years or older.
- g. "Parent" means a parent, legal guardian, or personal in parental relation to a Student.
- h. "Building Principal" or "Principal" means a building principal subject to annual performance evaluation review under Education Law §3012-c.
- i. "Classroom Teacher" or "Teacher" means a teacher subject to annual performance evaluation review under Education Law §3012-c.
- j. "Teacher or Principal Data" means personally identifiable information, as defined in Section 2-d, relating to the annual professional performance reviews of classroom teachers or principals that Vendor may receive from the District pursuant to the Agreement.
- k. "Personally Identifiable Information" shall have the following meanings:
 - i. As applied to Student Data, shall mean Personally Identifiable Information as defined in 34 CFR 99.3 implementing the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)
 - ii. As applied to Teacher or Principal Data, shall mean Personally Identifiable Information as that term is defined in Education Law §3012c.
- 1. "NIST Cybersecurity Framework" means the U.S. Department of Commerce National Institute for Standards and Technology Framework for Improving Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity (Version 1.1).
- 2. The District has developed the **Parents' Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security**, the terms of which are applicable to the Agreement between the District and the Vendor and are incorporated into this Supplemental Agreement. The Parents Bill of Rights for Data Privacy and Security states:
 - a. A student's personally identifiable information cannot be sold or released for any commercial purposes.
 - b. Parents have the right to inspect and review the complete contents of their child's education record maintained by the Rocky Point Union Free School District.
 - c. State and federal laws protect the confidentiality of personally identifiable information.

Safeguards associated with industry standards and best practices, including but not limited to, encryption, firewalls, and password protection, must be in place when data is stored or transferred.

e. Parents have the right to have complaints about possible breaches of student data addressed. Complaints should be directed to:

- f. "Supplemental information" for each contract into which the District enters with a third party who receives student data or teacher or principal data shall:
 - i. The exclusive purposes for which the student data or teacher or principal data will be used;
 - ii. How the third party contractor will ensure that the subcontractors, persons or entities that the third party contractor will share the student data or teacher or principal data with, if any, will abide by data protection and security requirements;
- iii. When the agreement expires and what happens to the student data or teacher or principal data upon expiration of the agreement;
- iv. If and how a parent, student, eligible student, teacher or principal may challenge the accuracy of the student data or teacher or principal data that is collected; and
- v. Where the student data or teacher or principal data will be stored (described in such a manner as to protect data security), and the security protections taken to ensure such data will be protected, including whether such data will be encrypted.
- g. This Bill of Rights is subject to change based on regulations of the Commissioner of Education and the New York State Education Department's Chief Privacy Officer, as well as emerging guidance documents.
- 3. As required by Education Law §2-d(3)(c), the District has developed the following "supplemental information" for the Agreement with the Vendor:
 - a. Student Data and/or Teacher or Principal Data which the Vendor comes into possession as part of its Agreement with the District shall be used for the purpose(s) of performing Contractor's obligations under this Supplemental Agreement and for such other purposes as are more fully described in the Service Agreement.

- b. The Vendor will ensure that any and all subcontractors, persons or entities that the Vendor may share the Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data with will abide by terms substantially similar to this Supplemental Agreement, and/or the data protection and security requirements set forth in Education Law §2-d.
- c. When the Agreement terminates between the District and the Vendor, the Vendor shall destroy the remaining Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data that the Vendor still maintains in any form in a manner agreeable to the district. For clarity, this destruction excludes any data which has been de-identified such that no Personally Identifiable Information remains. Contractor agrees it shall not attempt to re-identify any de-identified data.
- d. Any challenges concerning the accuracy of Student Data and/or Principal Data shall be handled directly between the District and the Parent, Student, Eligible Student, Teacher or Principal. The Vendor agrees to abide by the outcome of such challenges and make any corrections and/or changes to the applicable Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data as determined by the District.
- e. The District and the Vendor hereby agree that the Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data shall be stored in the following manner:

Data will be encrypted in transit and in storage using SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) and stored at no less than 128-bit level encryption.

4. As required by Education Law §2-d(5)(e), the Vendor hereby agrees that any officers or employees of the Vendor, including any assignees, who have access to Student Data or Teacher or Principal Data will have or will receive training on the Federal and New York State laws governing confidentiality of Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data prior to receiving access.

All Contractor employees participate in annual security and privacy training. We require adherence to federal and state laws that govern the confidentiality of Personally Identifiable Information in all subcontractor agreements.

- 5. As required by Education Law $\S2-d(5)(f)$, the Vendor hereby agrees that it shall:
 - a. Limit internal access to education records to those individuals that are determined to have legitimate educational interests;
 - b. Not use the educational records for any other purposes than those explicitly authorized in the Agreement or this Supplemental Agreement;
 - c. Except for authorized representatives of the Vendor to the extent they are carrying out the Service Agreement or this Supplemental Agreement, not disclose any Personally Identifiable Information to any other party:
 - i. Without the prior written consent of the Educational Agency. For clarity, consent is deemed to be provided for disclosure of PII to third party contractors listed in the Contractor's TOS; or
 - ii. Unless required by statute or court order and the Contractor provides a notice of the disclosure to the Educational Agency promptly, unless providing notice of the disclosure is expressly prohibited by the statute or court order.
 - d. Maintain administrative, technical, and physical safeguards that align with industry best practices including, but not necessarily limited to, disk encryption, file

encryption, firewalls, and password protection, and that align with the NIST Cybersecurity Framework 1.0;

- e. Store all data in the continental United States (CONUS) or Canada.
- f. Vendor will use encryption technology to protect data while in motion or in its custody from unauthorized disclosure using a technology or methodology specified by the secretary of the U S. Department of HHS in guidance issued under P.L. 111-5, Section 13402(H)(2).
- 6. Breach and unauthorized release of Personally Identifiable Information:
 - a. In accordance with Education Law §2-d(6), the Vendor shall be required to notify the District of any breach of security resulting in an unauthorized release of Student Data and/or Principal or Teacher Data by the Vendor or its subcontractors or assignees in violation of applicable state or federal law, the Parents Bill of Rights for Student Data Privacy and Security, this Supplemental Agreement and/or binding contractual obligations relating to data privacy and security, in the most expedient way possible and without unreasonable delay. The District shall, upon notification by the Vendor, be required to report to the Chief Privacy Officer, who is appointed by the State Education Department, any such breach of security and unauthorized release of such data.
 - b. In the case of an unauthorized release of Student Data, the District shall notify the Parent or Eligible Student of the unauthorized release of Student Data that includes Personally Identifiable Information from the student records of such Student in the most expedient way possible and without unreasonable delay. In the case of an unauthorized release of Teacher or Principal Data, the District shall notify each affected Teacher or Principal of the unauthorized release of data that includes Personally Identifiable Information from the Teacher or Principal's annual professional performance review in the most expedient way possible and without unreasonable delay.
 - c. To cooperate, to the extent reasonably necessary, with the District and law enforcement to protect the integrity of investigations into the breach or unauthorized release of Protected Data.
 - d. In the case of notification to a Parent, Eligible Student, Teacher or Principal due to the unauthorized release of student data by the Vendor, or its subcontractors or assignees, the Vendor shall promptly reimburse the educational agency for the full cost of such notification, as required by Education Law §2-d(6)(c). The Educational Agency agrees to adopt reasonable measures to limit the cost of such notification. A copy of the Contractor's security incident response plan is attached as Schedule 1.

The Contractor will notify of a confirmed breach within 24 hours or without undue delay.

- 7. Miscellaneous:
 - a. The District and Contractor agree that if applicable laws change and/or if the Commissioner of Education implements Regulations which affects the obligations of the parties herein, the District shall so notify the Contractor and this Supplemental Agreement shall be amended to incorporate such changes as necessary in order for the District and the Vendor to operate in compliance with the amendment or modified requirements under the applicable laws or regulations.

- b. Any ambiguity in this Supplemental Agreement shall be resolved in favor of a meaning that permits the District to comply with the applicable laws or regulations.
- c. Nothing express or implied in this Supplemental Agreement is intended to confer upon any person other than the District, Contractor and their respective successors and assigns any rights, remedies, obligations or liabilities.
- d. This agreement expires July 1, 2024. Upon expiration of this Supplemental Agreement without a successor agreement in place, the Vendor shall destroy all Protected Data.
- e. Upon expiration of this Supplemental Agreement with a successor agreement with another vendor in place, the Vendor will cooperate with the Rocky Point Union Free School District as necessary to transition protected data to the successor vendor prior to deletion. The Vendor shall thereafter securely delete and overwrite any and all Protected Data remaining in the possession of the Vendor or its assignees or subcontractors (including all hard copies, electronic versions or electronic imaging of hard copies of shared data, unless required by law) as well as any and all Protected Data maintained on behalf of the Vendor in secure data center facilities.
- f. Except as otherwise permitted in this Supplemental Agreement or the Service Agreement, the Vendor shall ensure that no copy, summary or extract of the Protected Data or any related work papers are retained on any storage medium whatsoever by the Vendor, its subcontractors or assignees, or the aforementioned secure data center facilities.

Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal Program

We have audited Rocky Point Union Free School District's (the "District") compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the *OMB Compliance Supplement* that could have a direct and material effect on each of the District's major federal programs for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021. The District's major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

Management's Responsibility

Management is responsible for compliance with federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of its federal awards applicable to its federal programs.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on compliance for each of the District's major federal programs based on our audit of the types of compliance requirements referred to above. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. *Code of Federal Regulations* Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards* (Uniform Guidance). Those standards and the Uniform Guidance require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the District's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of the District's compliance.

Opinion on Each Major Federal Program

In our opinion, the District complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its major federal programs for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021.

Report on Internal Control over Compliance

Management of the District is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the District's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with the Uniform Guidance, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the District's internal control over compliance.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is a reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of the Uniform Guidance. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by the Uniform Guidance

We have audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the fiduciary fund of the District as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2021, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise the District's basic financial statements. We issued our report thereon dated October 12, 2021, which contained unmodified opinions on those financial statements. Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the basic financial statements. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by the Uniform Guidance and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements. The information

has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the basic financial statements or to the basic financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedule of expenditures of federal awards is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements as a whole.

CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT

Agreement entered into this April 12, 2022, by and between the BOARD OF EDUCATION of the ROCKY POINT UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT (hereinafter "DISTRICT"), having its principal place of business at 90 Rocky Point-Yaphank Road, Rocky Point, New York 11778 and School Source Technologies (hereinafter "CONSULTANT"), having its principal place of business at 80 Orville Dr. Suite 100 Bohemia, NY 11716.

A. <u>TERM</u>

The term of this Agreement shall commence from its execution through June 30, 2022, inclusive, unless terminated as provided for in this Agreement. It is understood that the DISTRICT is under no obligation to renew this Agreement upon its expiration.

B. <u>SERVICES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:</u>

- 1. During the term of this Agreement, CONSULTANT shall provide those services set forth on the attached Schedule "A".
- 2. CONSULTANT shall perform all services under this Agreement in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws, rules, and regulations, as well as established policy guidance from the New York State Education Department.
- 3. CONSULTANT represents that all services under this Agreement shall be provided by qualified individuals of good character, and in good professional standing. CONSULTANT represents that no individuals providing services under this Agreement are currently charged, nor in the past have been charged with any relevant criminal or professional misconduct or incompetence.
- 4. Upon execution of this Agreement, at the request of the DISTRICT, CONSULTANT shall provide copies of required licenses/certifications of all personnel providing services under this Agreement. In the event that the required license/certification of any agent or employee of CONSULTANT providing services under this Agreement is revoked, terminated, suspended, or otherwise impaired, CONSULTANT shall immediately notify the DISTRICT in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
- 5. CONSULTANT shall observe and comply with all applicable DISTRICT Policies and Regulations while on the grounds of the DISTRICT or providing services pursuant to this Agreement.

- 6. CONSULTANT shall provide all services pursuant to this Agreement in a competent, professional, and timely manner.
- 7. CONSULTANT shall maintain records, logs, and/or reports in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, requirements of the New York State Education Department and DISTRICT policies and procedures in force during the term of this Agreement. The DISTRICT shall have the right to examine any or all records or accounts maintained and/or created by the CONSULTANT in connection with this Agreement, and upon request shall receive copies of the same within 24 hours of a demand.
- 8. Both parties to this Agreement understand that they may receive and/or come into contact with protected health information as defined by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). The parties hereby acknowledge their respective responsibilities pursuant to HIPAA and shall comply with said Regulations, as applicable.
- 9. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents agree that all information obtained in connection with the services performed pursuant to this Agreement is deemed confidential. Both parties, their employees, and/or agents shall not use, publish, discuss, disclose or communicate the contents of such information, directly or indirectly with third parties, except as provided for in this Agreement. Both parties further agree that any information received by either party's employees and/or agents in connection with this Agreement which concerns the personal, financial, or other affairs of the parties, their employees, agents, and/or students will be treated as confidential and will not be revealed to any other persons, firms, organizations, or third parties. In addition, both parties agree that information concerning any student covered by the terms of this Agreement shall not be released except as provided for by applicable law, rule, or regulation, including but not limited to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).
- 10. Insurance:
 - a. CONSULTANT, at its sole expense, shall procure and maintain such policies of commercial general liability, malpractice and other insurance as shall be necessary to insure the CONSULTANT and the DISTRICT, including the Board of Education, employees, agents, and volunteers, as additional insureds, against any claim for liability, personal injury, or death occasioned directly or indirectly by CONSULTANT in connection with the performance of CONSULTANT'S responsibilities under this Agreement; each such policy shall provide a minimum coverage of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence subject to an annual aggregate of Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000).

- b. The insurance is to be underwritten by a licensed and/or admitted New York State Insurer with a minimum Best's rating of A-minus.
- c. In the event any of the aforementioned insurance policies are cancelled or not renewed, the CONSULTANT shall notify the District in writing within thirty (30) days of such cancellation or non-renewal.

C. <u>COMPENSATION:</u>

1. The DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT in accordance with the following fee schedule, following the presentation of detailed invoices by CONSULTANT to the DISTRICT:

- 2. The CONSULTANT shall submit an invoice for the full payment as reflected in Attachment B on the date immediately following the return date of the Transportation RFP. The DISTRICT shall pay CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of the DISTRICT's receipt of such invoice.
- 4. The DISTRICT shall give the CONSULTANT notice of any invoice disputes within twenty (20) days of its receipt of the invoice and reserves the right to withhold payment pending the resolution of the dispute.
- 5. Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its personnel shall share or accept any fee or gratuity for services provided pursuant to this Agreement except as expressly set forth in this Agreement.

D. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

- 1. <u>Termination</u>:
 - a. Either the CONSULTANT or the DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. Such notice shall be given in accordance with the requirements for all notices pursuant to this Agreement set forth below.
 - b. The parties agree that CONSULTANT'S failure to comply with any terms or conditions of this Agreement will provide a basis for the DISTRICT to immediately terminate this Agreement without any further liability to CONSULTANT.
 - c. In the event the CONSULTANT or the DISTRICT terminates this Agreement with or without cause, such termination of the Agreement shall not discharge the parties' existing obligations to each other as of the effective date of termination.

2. Independent Contractor:

- a. CONSULTANT will be engaged as an Independent Contractor, and therefore be solely responsible for the payment of federal and state income taxes applicable to this Agreement; and any other applicable withholding.
- b. Neither CONSULTANT nor any of its employees, agents, or assigns will be eligible for any employee benefits whatsoever relative to this contract including, but not limited to, Social Security, New York State Worker's Compensation, unemployment insurance, New York State Employee's Retirement System, health or dental insurance, or malpractice insurance, or the like.
- c. DISTRICT, if required by Federal or State requirements, will submit a Form 1099 and IT 2102.1 respectively at year-end to the Federal Government for all individuals having a gross income exceeding \$600, which thereupon will be reported for income tax purposes.
- 3. DISTRICT reserves the right to reject any of the CONSULTANT'S staff, which the DISTRICT, at its sole discretion, may deem unqualified.
- 4. <u>Defense / Indemnification</u>
 - a. CONSULTANT agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the DISTRICT, its officers, directors, agents, or employees against all claims, demands, actions, lawsuits, costs, damages and expenses, including attorneys' fees, judgments, fines and amounts arising from any willful act, omission, error, recklessness or negligence of the CONSULTANT, its officers, directors, agents or employees in connection with the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement. The obligations pursuant to this provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
- 5. All notices which are required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be deemed to have been given if delivered personally or sent by registered or certified mail, addressed as follows:
